The course

This course in the theory of functions of one complex variable is a continuation of Math 617, which is the prerequisite. Topics include applications of Cauchy's integral formula, analytic continuation, harmonic functions, entire functions, and Runge's approximation theorem.

Textbook We will be using an out-of-print book, *Invitation to Complex Analysis*, by Ralph P. Boas (my father). I am in the process of preparing a new edition of the book, and I will post pdf files of the chapters as the course progresses.
